

VISITING RESEARCHER PROGRAM

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

The International Centre for Comparative Criminology provides active researchers in criminology and related fields, the opportunity to work and study at the Center to participate in its activities. The CICC can accommodate researcher for a period of 1 day up to 2 months.

Depending on the annual budget available, the CICC could reimburse a maximum of \$ 1,000 CAD for accommodation in Montreal for a two-month period, in proportion of the stay (upon presentation of original receipts ; allow time for the refund).

Travel must take place between September 2018 and June 2019. Successful applicants will have access to an office, Internet access, Library of Humanities and Social Sciences at the University of Montreal and administrative support from the Centre.

COMMITMENT AND CONDITIONS

- The candidate must hold a Ph.D. in criminology or a related field (for graduate applicants with a Master diploma, see **the program for Visiting Researcher Student**). Moreover, for a stay of more than 120 days, a work permit and a visa, according to the country of origin, is required, if applicable, for non-residents of Canada. ICCC takes in charge a part of the work permit fee and it is the responsibility of the visiting researcher to obtain a visa, if applicable;
- The successful applicant agrees to participate in scientific activities organized by the CICC (conferences, workshops, etc.) and to present a lecture on his research during his stay at the Centre.
- The Centre will NOT pay any wages, travel or living expenses, or assume the costs related to the research project of the candidate.
- Other documents, which will be specified as appropriate, will be required to complete the application.

SELECTION

- The jury is composed of the director, assistant director and a regular researcher of the CICC;
- The length of stay may vary depending on the file submitted and the nature of the research, as well as places and annual budget available;

APPLICATION

Applications must include:

- A curriculum vitae;
- A two to three pages outlining the project to be conducted at the CICC;
- A cover letter specifying the requested dates of stay;
- A letter of invitation from a regular researcher of our Centre with a brief summary of the reason for the invitation including details of the project or the work to be undertaken.
