

# POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP ON RESILIENCE YEAR 2019

## GOAL

The international Centre for Comparative Criminology\* (CICC), an inter-universities center affiliated to Université de Montréal and Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières, is offering a salary of \$ 33 485 CAD per year to fund a [postdoctoral fellowship](#) on resilience, plus [social benefits](#) (holidays, possibility of contributing to the voluntary retirement savings scheme, 3% of the annual salary in compensation for collective insurances, etc.). This fellowship can also be enhanced by a [postdoctoral grant complement](#) (worth \$ 5 000 CAD).

The successful applicant will be attached to the “The Art of Resilience” project, which aims to understand the practices of security professionals through their implementation of the concept of resilience across two domains: natural disasters related to the advent of the Anthropocene and cybersecurity attacks and data breaches. Through a documentary analysis and interviews with professionals who responded to major crises, resilience will be examined and thus contribute to enriching the many theoretical and normative perspectives on the subject. The project is supported by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) for a period of 4 years.

The candidate will produce research outputs and contribute to developing future research projects on the above issues.

## CONDITIONS

- You must hold a PhD degree before starting the postdoctoral research and for no more than three years prior to the proposed starting date of the fellowship;
- You will be supervised by Prof. Benoît Dupont (Criminology, Université de Montréal) and Prof. Clifford Shearing (Criminology, Griffith University and University of Cape Town);
- You must have completed University studies in a field relevant or related to criminology: Sociology, political science, anthropology, law, psychology, and economics are the principal related fields;
- Master English and functional French. You must be able to write scientific papers in English;
- The postdoctoral fellowship will take place from January to December 2019 (35h/week), with a possible renewal for a second year based on evidence of satisfactory academic progress and availability of funds.

## REQUIREMENTS

Your application can be written in English

- A letter of application outlining the applicant’s expertise, research interests and experience;
- A reference letter from the PhD supervisor;
- A transcript of academic records;
- An example of written work;
- A curriculum vitae outlining your main scholarly achievements.

## SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION

The candidate must submit the application to the CICC **before December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018**.
