## COURSE FEE (2-WEEKS)

### REQUIREMENTS FOR COURSE PARTICIPANTS

Lectures will take place daily between 09:00 a.m. and 20:00 p.m., with a siesta (break) between 13:00 p.m. and 17:00 p.m. There will be no lectures on the middle weekend of the course (20-21 May). Excursions are planned for this weekend. In order for participants to graduate from the course, it is requested that each participant complete the following:

- Attend all lectures; and
- Give a 10-minute oral presentation on a victimological topic of his or her choice.

All participants will receive detailed information of these requirements on the opening day of the course. Participants will have the opportunity to consult and receive guidance for their presentations from the international Resource Faculty. Upon completion of the course and its requirements, participants will be awarded the highly-desired certificate at the graduation ceremony (<u>Saturday</u>, <u>May 27, 2023</u>).
