## Rapport de stage (mi-parcours et final)

*Subject*: Rapport de mi-parcours d'avancement des travaux

Over the last 6 months I developed and delivered an undergraduate *Introduction to Criminology* course at the University of Ottawa (January-April), began reworking a drafted article on the similarities of 'contrasting' theories of deviance, provided one communication in the activities of the CICC, presented at this year's *Association internationale des criminologues de langue française* conference in Versailles, and, on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July 2016, will present preliminary findings of my postdoctoral research at the *Association internationale des sociologues de langue française* conference in Montréal.

Regarding the postdoctoral project itself, the following is a list of accomplishments:

- Familiarized myself with three research databases (CanLII, CAIJ, and SOQUIJ) and, using those databases, collected all cases for which an individual was charged under the authority of section 172.1 (luring a child) of the Criminal Code of Canada in the province of Québec. This process required a number of different searches to be run through each database and the manual scanning of 11,385 documented cases to produce some of the study's analytical corpus;
- Began coding and analyzing the above cases, as well as writing a preliminary or running draft of the related forthcoming article;
- Identified, collected, and analyzed the Plumitifs of all persons charged in the above cases;
- Collected, read, and catalogued peer-reviewed articles on related topics of study;
- Performed a preliminary analysis into the possibility of expanding the study to include additional geographic regions. To complete this preliminary analysis, I familiarized myself with two additional research databases (LexisNexis/QuickLaw and Westlaw Next Canada) and, using those databases, collected all cases for which an individual was charged under the authority of section 172.1 (luring a child) of the Criminal Code of Canada in Canada's remaining provinces and territories. This process required a number of different searches to be run through each database and the manual scanning of a large number of documented cases.

## Subject: Rapport final

Building on the work presented in my *Rapport de mi-parcours d'avancement des travaux*, the following is a list of accomplishments completed over the final six months of my postdoctoral fellowship:

- Presented preliminary findings of my postdoctoral research at the Association internationale des sociologues de langue française conference in Montréal (July);
- Wrote and revised an article (On the Quebec Judiciary and Phenomenon of Online Child Luring) on the above described research
  - $\circ~$  Submitted this article for publication in a peer-reviewed Canadian  $_{journal}$
  - Successfully applied to present the theoretical arguments of this work at the 2017 *Critical Perspectives Conference* in Ottawa;
- Reassessed, grouped, and put in chart form statistical information for a second article related to the above project. An outline for this article has already been completed and I will be looking to submit the final product for publication in the coming months;
- Worked under the supervision of CICC Chair Carlo Morselli, and in partnership with Axelle François, to compile a list of funding opportunities available to CICC researchers;
- ➢ Became a father.

In the six weeks following my fellowship I have:

- Interviewed for a tenure track position at an Ontario university
  - I am currently awaiting the results of that interview;
- (Am scheduled to be) Interviewed for the Government of Canada's 2016 Policy Leader Recruitment Program;
- Commenced a 2-month contract with the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) of Canada.
